The Hong Kong International Music Festival is rooted in Hong Kong. It is a huge music festival that seamlessly merges Eastern and Western cultures, covering classical, pop, modern, and diverse musical cultures. The Festival brings music talents and masters from around the world to Hong Kong with various activities, including music exchange concerts, study tours, competitions, music education seminars, music appreciation, and symposiums, encouraging the sharing of diverse music cultures and promoting the growth of music and cultural contacts between Hong Kong and other countries and regions. The 1st Hong Kong International Music Festival occurred in 2013 and drew approximately 3,000 attendees. The 6th Music Festival in 2019, the number of participants had grown to nearly 90,000 people from over 150 countries and regions, including China, the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Germany, Australia, Switzerland, France, Portugal, Italy, Russia, Ukraine, Singapore, Korea, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, Vietnam, and cities such as Macao and Taiwan.

We are confident that through the interaction and research of experts from all over the world, we will be able to provide important parameters and educational frameworks for the promotion of music education that will inspire the mindset of children and youths, as well as significantly contribute to the creation of a global musical density for the sake of the people who live in the worldwide village in peace and love. The Music Festival has been recognised by many international music academies and educational institutes, including Schoenfeld International Music Society, Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory, Sydney Conservatorium of Music, Ocean University of China (Department of Art), Statal Conservatory G. Puccini-Gallarate, University of North Dakota, Vancouver Academy of Music S.K. Lee University, The University of Texas at Dallas, Texas Christian University The School of Music, The Mykola Lysenko Lviv National Music Festival will continue to place music at the centre of its efforts to promote exchanges and mutual understanding among music cultures in China, locally and internationally, developing mutual recognition and respect among music lovers worldwide. More than 5,000 specialists, academicians, and participants are expected to attend next year's event, transforming Hong Kong into a vital music city.

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
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

Rules and Regulations

- 1) This competition welcomes music lovers from all over the world each individual can participate in four categories max.
- 2) Registration for the HKIMF should be done online. If you are unable to do so, please fill in a paper application form; if you want to participate in more than one category you will need to fill in a separate application form.
- 3) If a contestant satisfies the application criteria, the contestant is allowed to contest in age groups above their own.
- 4) The organizing committee will start announcing the contestants that have entered the final round after mid-July; finalists will be contacted via regional offices or email. A full list of finalists will be posted on to the official HKIMF website https://hkmusic.hk and official WeChat account (search HK_IMF).
- 5) Contestants MUST be registered online in order to browse their results or the list of finalists. Finalists who are heading to Hong Kong for the finals must use their region's custom link to confirm their details (e.g. providing a copy of their travel documents) and pay the fees.
- 6) All contestants must be registered at the specified venue 20 minutes before the competition starts or else, they risk disqualification.
- 7) All contestants in the individual division, except accompaniment, MUST recite all their performance pieces. If sheet music is seen during performance, there will be a point deduction.
- 8) Contestants MUST find their own accompaniment and prepare music stand(s) for them.
- 9) The order of performance in the finals will be decided by the organizing committee, the decision made is final.
- 10) All videos, uploaded via the online system, for competitive use MUST not contain any editing.
- 11) Contestants MUST be the copyright owner of the details they submit and understand that the organizing committee has the right to use those details; not limited to photos and recordings they provide.
- 12) Contestants MUST have black and white confirmation by the organizing committee on whether the instrument they will be performing with can be provided by the authorities (e.g. marimba)
- 13) Contestants MUST take the risk that the instrument they loan might affect performance quality as the organizing committee cannot ensure the quality of the instrument loaned out fits all loanees' expectations.
- 14) Contestants who are loaning instruments need to look after the instrument loaned. If manmade damages are to be found upon return, the contestant will be held responsible for the repair costs and/or part restoration.
- 15) Playing music in the background for accompaniment is not allowed except for specific competition categories. For those who will be playing background music for accompaniment, please prepare your own flash storage and have the music file format in .mp3.
- 16) Each division may have tied contestants. The jury will have the decision to evenly distribute the prize money and rearrange prizes.
- 17) Winners MUST attend and claim their prize at the awards ceremony. 1st runner-ups of all divisions are required to perform at the winners' concert. Failure to do so may result in the organizing committee confiscating prize money and prizes already awarded.
- 18) The organizing committee will be selecting the performers, the order of performance and performance pieces for the winners' concert. The overall champion(s) of the HKIMF will be judged and announced during the concert.
- 19) The jury can, under certain conditions, add additional prizes onto any division. If there are divisions that contestants could not reach the minimum performance requirements, the jury can decide to NOT award any prize or prize money and have the ranking left empty. The decision made by the jury will be final.
- 20) Prize money will be distributed after the awards ceremony via cash, bank transfer or telegraphic transfer. Any overseas transfer will be according to the exchange rate at the moment of distribution. The organizing committee will not be responsible for any surcharges generated during the transfer process.
- 21) Decisions made by the jury and the organizing committee is final.
- 22) The jury has the right to halt any contestants' performance at any time, the decision made is final. Resistance is futile.
- 23) If a contestant has any familial relations with members of the jury, it has to be stated within the application form. If the contestant has a current teacher-student relationship with a member of the jury, that specific member of the jury is forbade to judge the performance of their student. If there are any violations in this regard, the contestant will be disgualified.
- 24) The organizing committee is the sole party that has the right to arrange photo-taking, any other kind of recording during competitive performances and use the recorded material for promotional and/or commercial purposes. Contestants by default agrees to this upon application.
- 25) Contestants need to look after their personal belongings. The organizing committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to contestants' belongings, it is advised to purchase travel insurance.
- 26) Contestants are responsible for sourcing insurance coverage that suits them from appropriate agencies to address all matters related to overseas travel. This includes but is not limited to unforeseen circumstances, natural disasters, accidents, medical emergencies, personal injury, personal property, and instrument insurance, to safeguard against any potential accidents that may occur during the journey and throughout the event.

Failure to do so may result in the teacher being unable to apply for the certificate (acquiring the Instructor's Certificate requires the teacher reaching the organizing committee's requirements).
- 32) The organizing committee reserves the right to interpret the general rules and regulations of the competition. In the event of any disputes related to this event, the decision of the organizing committee shall be final.
